

### > 4,763 unique children ages 0-5 served in FY 2020-21




- 1,500 additional children received indirect services




The Program Provides:

- Kit for New Parents, packed with child development and health resources (e.g., "What To Do If My Child Gets Sick booklet", oral health, and vaccination information)
- Support for families to access:
  - CalFresh
  - WIC
  - Semillitas (Children's Savings Accounts)
  - State Student Identification (SSID) number at birth
  - Medi-Cal Enrollment Assistance for eligible newborns


## Women's Recovery Response: Grant Funding Opportunity
